Called to be Disciples

As I write this, the summer is winding down, and I recall the various celebrations that we shared over the last couple of months. We had a short fast in preparation for the Feast of the Apostles, and the celebration of this feast reminds us that Jesus chose simple men whom the Holy Spirit would anoint and empower. Jesus knew that He would need some dedicated people to spread His message around the world. And so, He chose twelve men. These men were not graduates of rabbinical schools. They weren't well known. They weren't rich. They were all rather ordinary. Peter, Andrew, James and John were fishermen. We know that St. Peter denied Christ. Saint Paul was a persecutor of Christians before his conversion. Matthew was a tax collector (tax collectors were dishonest and were loathed by the people of the day). So, here we have not only people who were somewhat ordinary, but people who had some serious flaws that became Christ's disciples, His inner circle.

Later on, God's grace enabled these men to become leaders of the church, amazing orators and writers, and through them, the message of the Gospel was spread throughout the world. The lessons of the disciples are three: First, ordinary people can become extraordinary through the grace of God. Working with God, through their faith, they accepted God's grace and used it to do extraordinary things. So, it was their faith combined with God's grace that allowed these ordinary people to do extraordinary things.

The second lesson of the disciples is this: Every saint has a past. Every sinner has a future. It's not how you start, but how you end up that is important to the Lord. If your life isn't going particularly well right now, if it isn't going in a particularly Christ-centered direction, you have the power to change that.

There is no one who is alive who has to feel like they are doomed. God's grace is accessible to everyone. And so is the path to salvation. The path is different for each person, but there is a path to salvation for everyone. The paths of Peter and Paul and Matthew took them through egregious sins, to monumental repentance toextraordinary contribution to the life of the Church. Our paths can do the same for us. All of us have the capability to repent. All of us have been given some gift by God by which we can contribute to the furthering of the message of the Gospel.

The third lesson of the disciples is that God needs some dedicated people today, just as He did two thousand years ago, to spread the Christian message. He needs some men to step forward to be priests. But this isn't all that is needed. Not every disciple has to be a priest. Not every disciple has to pick up all of his or her possessions and go to a faraway land to spread the Gospel. The twelve men that Jesus chose, yes, they up and followed. However, this is not needed by every disciple today. We can model Christian behavior at work, in our neighborhoods, in our local grocery store, pretty much anywhere.

We are all called to be disciples. We are all called to act like the disciples. Use your talents to heal the lost and embrace the lonely. Model love and you'll spread the message. Use your faith in concert with God's grace and your life can have the same effect on others that the original twelve had on the world.

We certainly have done so this year with great events like our Festival. I express thanks on behalf of the entire community and those who visited and partook in this wonderful event. You truly lived up to your Apostolic calling and were amazing disciples.

As people come to our community, let's remember our calling to love and bring people to Christ. Every saint has a past. Every sinner has a future. Whatever may be in your past, start your future today.



Vacation Church Camp 2025: "Full of Grace The Feasts of the Theotokos and Virgin Mary"

From July 21–25, 2025, our parish joyfully hosted its first annual Vacation Church Camp, welcoming children for a faith-filled week themed "Full of Grace – The Feasts of the Theotokos and Virgin Mary." Through daily lessons, crafts, games, songs, and movement, our young participants explored the beauty and significance of the major feasts of the Virgin Mary and deepened their love and understanding of her unique role in salvation history.

Each day focused on a different feast of the Theotokos, helping children encounter the life of Mary in a way that was accessible, engaging, and meaningful. The camp was filled with joyful energy, prayer, and creativity as our youth connected their faith to hands-on experiences.

Monday - The Nativity of the Theotokos (September 8)

We began the week by celebrating the birth of the Virgin Mary, a moment of joy and hope for all creation. Children learned how Saints Joachim and Anna, her parents, prayed fervently for a child and were blessed with the Theotokos. The start of our daily movement with a game called True or False started. We asked them questions and they had to run to one side of the gym if the answer was true and the other side of the gym if it was false. Crafts included making icons of the Nativity of Mary and celebrated her birthday by singing Happy Birthday to Mary with cupcakes!

Tuesday - The Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple (November 21)

On the second day, campers learned about Mary's offering to God at the temple as a young child. This theme of dedication and preparation led to meaningful discussions about offering ourselves to God through prayer, kindness, and obedience. We created an icon of the Entrance of Mary as their craft to take home.

Wednesday - The Annunciation (March 25)

Midweek brought the powerful moment when the Archangel Gabriel announced to Mary that she would become the Mother of God. The children reflected on Mary's "Yes" – her faithful response, "Let it be to me according to Your word." The children decorated their angel cookie as their craft and started painting the rocks for the garden.

Thursday - The Dormition of the Theotokos (August 15)

On Thursday, we honored the Dormition (or Falling Asleep) of the Theotokos. Though a more solemn theme, the day was filled with hope and beauty, as children learned that Mary was taken into heaven and remains close to us as our intercessor. Crafts included creating a garden with a standing votive in the back area of the church that has our prostinitarion which hold icons and is a perfect place to pray anytime. They also planted flowers to take home. They painted rocks for the garden as well.

Friday - Review of the week

We closed the week with a review of VCC and our love for the Theotokos. Our craft today was a windsock with the icons of the feasts for our homes. We practiced our song for Sunday to present what we learned

Sunday Participation - Sharing the Light of the Theotokos

The joy and learning of Vacation Church Camp continued into Sunday, July 27, during and after the Divine Liturgy. Dressed in their camp t-shirts and full of enthusiasm, the children gathered in front of the congregation to share what they had learned.

Fr. Luke warmly engaged the children by asking questions about the feast days they had studied. With smiles and excitement, the children eagerly responded—when asked, "Who was late to Mary's funeral?" they all cheerfully exclaimed, "Thomas!", recalling the story of the Apostle arriving late to the Dormition. Their joyful participation showed how deeply they had absorbed the stories and teachings of the week.

Following the Q&A, the children sang "The Feasts of Mary" by Gigi Baba Shadid, a song that captured the heart of the week's lessons through joyful music and movement. Their voices lifted in praise filled the church with a palpable sense of JOY. This moment became more than just a performance—it became a witness. The presence and participation of our youngest parishioners opened the hearts and eyes of the entire community to a renewed understanding of the faith. The feast days of the Theotokos were no longer just dates on a calendar—they came alive, revealing their deep significance in the life of the Church and in our own lives.

Throughout the week, the children not only learned about the feasts of the Theotokos but also grew in faith, friendship, and love for Mary, our heavenly mother. We are grateful to our dedicated volunteers, parents, and clergy who made this week possible through their planning, prayers, and presence.

May the Theotokos continue to guide and protect our parish children as they grow in the grace and love of Christ!







As a reminder, the General Assembly is a meeting of all members in good A member in good standing is defined by the Uniform Parish Regulations of the Archdiocese as any person eighteen years of age or older who was baptized according to the rites of the Orthodox Church, or was Orthodox received the Church Chrismation, who lives according to the faith and canons of the Orthodox Church, who has met or paid 68% of his or her stewardship obligations for 2025 at least 10 days prior to the Fall General Assembly, and abides by the Uniform Parish Regulations of the Archdiocese and the by-laws of the Parish. Members in good standing in attendance constitute a quorum of the General Assembly.

We urge all of our members to attend since there are important issues being discussed. Please remember that a quorum consists of 10% of the total number of stewards.




